LegalServer Consultant

Description

lowa Legal Aid seeks proposals for a consultant for the transition from its current case management software, Pika, to its new case management software, LegalServer. The consultant will facilitate communication and interactions with LegalServer as well as help navigate the nuances of implementing new technology in legal services. Iowa Legal Aid has used Pika since 2003 and will need a hands-on consultant who can provide customized support in addition to robust support and training to the organization's over 100 employees & volunteers throughout the transition process.

Tasks include:

- Guide, coach, train, and mentor Iowa Legal Aid's core team members
- Orchestrate migration of data, including advising on data fields necessary to migrate
- Assist in planning internal stakeholder duties and deadlines regarding data mapping, branch logic, flows, and migration
- Communicate with LegalServer to determine deadlines
- Advocate for ILA throughout the process
- Assist in designing and implementing the new case management system, including branch logic, flows, and troubleshooting after go-live
- Assist with staff training and education, including developing specialized training videos, vignettes, and materials for existing staff and enhancing Iowa Legal Aid's training plan for future staff
- Provide support and troubleshooting to staff members as needed

- The project, including testing, roll out, evaluation, issue management, and final adjustments, is anticipated to last until summer 2022.
